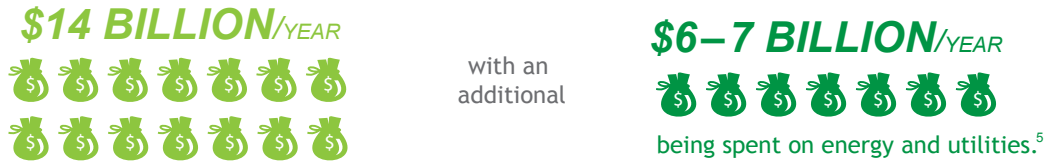


Energy Efficient Alternatives

According to the National Center of Education Statistics (NCES), the amount that colleges and universities spend on operations and maintenance of buildings and grounds equals

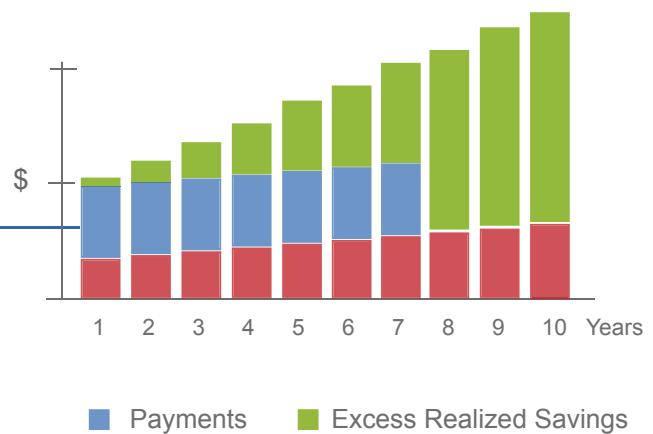


Many schools are quickly realizing that the potential savings energy projects can generate makes them different from other deferred maintenance projects.
